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I. Introduction

1. The Registry hereby transmits to the Defence 92 applications for reparations (“Applications”) in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo*, in accordance with Trial Chamber II’s (“Chamber”) “Décision portant sur les demandes de prorogation de délai présentées par le Bureau du conseil public pour les victimes, le Greffe et les Représentants légaux du groupe de victimes V02”, of 6 April 2017 (“Decision of 6 April 2017”).¹

II. Procedural history

2. On 31 March 2017, the Registry transmitted to the Chamber 92 applications for reparations together with the Registry’s report on its assessment of the applications against the requirements of rule 85 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (“Rules”).²
3. In its Decision of 6 April 2017, the Chamber ordered the Registry to transmit to the Defence, by 24 April 2017 at the latest, redacted versions of the reparations forms that had been previously transmitted in original version to the Chamber on 31 March 2017.³

III. Classification

4. Pursuant to regulation 23bis(1) of the Regulations of the Court (“Regulations”), the Applications are transmitted as confidential redacted annexes, in accordance with the Decision of 6 April 2017.

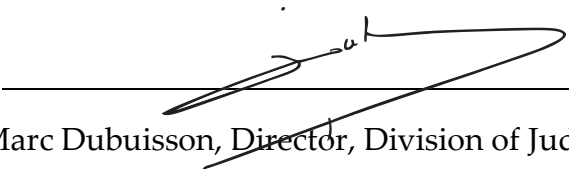
