I. Introduction

1. The Registry hereby transmits to Trial Chamber VI (“Chamber”) supplementary information concerning ten victims¹ (“Victims”) in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda* (“Ntaganda case”).

II. Procedural History

2. On 16 June and 2 July 2015, the Chamber admitted the Victims to participate in the present case.²
3. On 6 June 2017, the legal representative of the child soldier victims (“LRV”) transmitted to the Victims Participation and Reparations Section of the Registry (“VPRS”) supplementary information concerning the Victims and requested the transmission of this information to the Chamber.³

III. Classification

4. Pursuant to regulation 23bis(1) of the Regulations of the Court (“RoC”), the annexes to this document are submitted as “confidential *ex parte*, only available to the Chamber and the Legal Representative of the Child Soldier Victims” because they contain confidential information that may lead to the identification of victims.

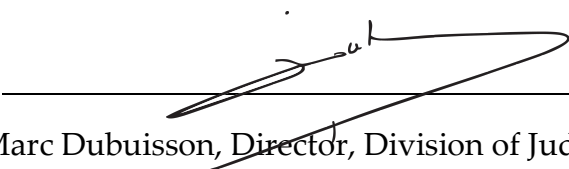
