I. Procedural History

1. The Trust Fund refers the Trial Chamber to the procedural history of its second progress report, filed on 21 April 2017.¹

2. The Trust Fund hereby submits its third progress report relevant to the implementation of the collective reparations ordered in the *Lubanga* case, including the symbolic reparations.

II. Classification of the Present Filing

3. The Trust Fund has classified annex A of the present filing as confidential, *ex parte* pursuant to regulation 23 *bis* (1) of the Regulations of the Court, on the basis that it contains confidential information pertaining to the ongoing procurement process, issues that do not relate to the rights of the convicted person.

III. Third Progress report

4. With regard to the symbolic reparations component, the third progress report contains information on the recent developments in the procurement process, since the Trust Fund submitted its second progress report, including the Trust Fund's selection of the organization to become the implementing partner of the symbolic collective reparations programme.

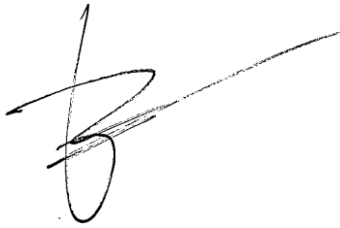
5. With regard to the collective service-based component, the report contains information on the status of the procurement process.
