I. Introduction

1. Upon the request of the Common Legal Representatives of Victims (“CLRs”) and pursuant to Trial Chamber VI’s order in the fourth decision on victims’ participation in trial proceedings (“Chamber” and “Fourth Victim Participation Decision”)¹, the Registry hereby transmits two assessment tables prepared by the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”) and nine resumption of action forms.
2. Over the last two months, the Common Legal Representative of the former child soldiers (“CLR1”) reported the death of three of her clients and submitted resumption of action requests for each.² During the same period, the Common Legal Representative of the victims of the attacks allegedly committed by the *Union de patriotes congolais* and the *Forces patriotiques pour la libération de Congo* (“CLR2”) provided supplementary information³ for six of the applications reported on in the Registry’s Ninth Periodic Report on Victims in the Case and their General Situation (“Ninth Periodic Report”).⁴ Pending a decision on the status of the resumption of action requests submitted here and in the Ninth Periodic Report, the number of participating victims has been reduced by 3 and is now at 2,097.⁵

II. Classification

3. This transmission filing is submitted pursuant to regulation 24*bis* of the Regulations of the Court (“RoC”) and pursuant to a request from the CLRs to

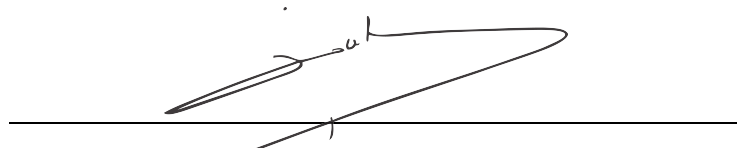

transmit the resumption of action forms ahead of the CLRs' respective closing briefs. In accordance with regulation 23*bis*(1) of the RoC, annexes 1 to 4 to this filing are submitted as confidential *ex parte*, only available to the Chamber and CLR1 and annexes 5 to 11 are submitted as confidential *ex parte*, only available to the Chamber and CLR2 because they contain sensitive information that relates to the safety and physical well-being of victims.

III. Submission

4. The Registry hereby transmits, as annexes 1 and 5, two assessment tables on the resumption of action forms received and, as annexes 2 to 4 and 6 to 11, the resumption of action forms themselves, together with supplementary information.
