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I. Introduction

1. In paragraph 59 of the Decision Establishing the Principles Applicable to Victims' Applications for Participation ("First Decision")¹, the Single Judge ordered the Registry to transmit to the Chamber "on a rolling basis and in unredacted form all complete applications and any supporting documentation in its possession."²

II. Procedural History

2. On 17 September 2018, the Registry transmitted 20 applications to the Chamber under the classification of "Group A"³ (applicants who clearly qualify as victims) ("Group A") and a further 14 applications under the classification of "Group C" (applicants for whom the Registry could not make a clear determination for any reason).⁴
3. On 6 November 2018, the Registry transmitted a further 74 applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A.⁵
4. On 25 January 2019, the Registry transmitted a third batch of 83 applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A⁶ and 15 applications under the classification of Group C.⁷

5. On 12 February 2019, the Registry transmitted a fourth batch of 80 applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A.⁸
6. On 15 March 2019, the Registry transmitted a fifth batch of 163 applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A.⁹
7. On 9 April 2019, the Registry transmitted a sixth batch of 71¹⁰ applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A and 3 applications under the classification of Group B.¹¹
8. On 18 April 2019, the Registry transmitted a seventh batch of 329 applications to the Chamber under the classification of Group A and two applications under the classification of Group B.¹²

III. Applicable Law

9. The present report is submitted pursuant to article 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 85 to 89 and 92 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court, and regulations 107 to 109 of the Regulations of the Registry.

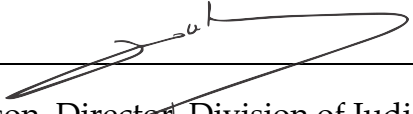
