NOTIFICATION

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) submits this Communication Report regarding the disclosure of evidence pursuant to article 61(3)(b) of the Statute and the Single Judge of Pre-Trial Chamber II’s Decision on Disclosure and Related Matters.¹

I. CONFIDENTIALITY

2. The Annex, appended to this filing, is classified as “Confidential” as it relates to evidence disclosed *inter partes* that should not be released to the public.

II. DISCLOSURE OF EVIDENCE

3. On 29 August 2019, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence of Alfred YEKATOM and Patrice-Edouard NGAÏSSONA a total of 74 items. These items are listed in the Confidential Annex.

4. The items consist of 54 transcribed portions of witness interviews and a further 20 other items of evidence referred to therein. The Prosecution does not rely on these transcripts or the referenced items for the confirmation hearing. Although provided for the purposes of completeness, the material is designated as INCRIM given that it comprises parts of interviews wherein the Prosecution relies on other transcribed portions. These portions were duly disclosed by the 19 August 2019 deadline and

included in the Prosecution's List of Evidence, in compliance with the Chamber's decision of 15 May 2019.²
