Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) hereby submits this Addendum to its request for access to the identity and applications of participating victims (“Request”), filed before Trial Chamber X (“Chamber”) on 21 November 2019.¹
2. The Prosecution proposes the following modification of its Request in order to expeditiously meet its primary goal of identifying dual status victim/witnesses, if any, and to discharge its disclosure obligations.
3. The Prosecution withdraws its Request to receive all identities and applications of participating victims from the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”).
4. Instead:
 - the Prosecution will liaise directly with the VPRS to identify any dual status victim/witness;
 - if dual status victim/witnesses are identified, the VPRS would transmit to the Prosecution unredacted versions of their applications, together with any supporting documents; and
 - the Prosecution will apply redactions, as necessary and in consultation with the VPRS and the LRVs, before disclosing the applications and supporting documents to the Defence. The Prosecution will ensure that redactions applied are consistent with those applied to their statements and other material already disclosed to the Defence pursuant to the *Decision on the*

*Evidence Disclosure Protocol and Other Related Matters*² and any decision of Pre-Trial Chamber I and Trial Chamber X on protective measures.

Relief requested

5. The Prosecution respectfully requests the Chamber to issue directions based on its proposal above.
