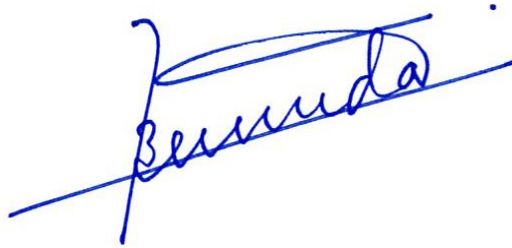

I. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

1. The Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) hereby notifies Trial Chamber V (“Chamber”) of its compliance with the Chamber’s 15 June 2020 Decision.¹

2. On 3 July 2020, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence of Alfred YEKATOM and of Patrice-Edouard NGAISSONA a total of 52 items pursuant to article 67(2) regarding Prosecution Witness P-0801.² Three of these items consist of the transcribed Witness Statement ordered disclosed,³ and the remaining 49 items may also affect the Witness’s credibility. The disclosed items contain redactions consistent with the Redactions Protocol in this case.⁴

In addition to the redactions already applied in the *Bemba et al.* case, the Prosecution applied redactions to protect the identities of Prosecution and Registry staff operating in the field. Consistently with paragraphs 33 and 34 of the Decision, it did not apply additional redactions to protect the identities of witnesses who testified pursuant to protective measures under rule 74(7)(b) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence in the *Bemba* main case and the in the *Bemba et al.* case, as the Decision did not expressly address the issues raised as concerns this provision.
