I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Prosecution submits to the Single Judge Rosario Salvatore Aitala (“Single Judge”), acting for Pre-Trial Chamber II, this notification of the disclosure of evidence pursuant to articles 61(3)(b) of the Rome Statute.

II. CLASSIFICATION

2. This filing is classified as public with confidential Annexes A-B. The Prosecution classifies Annexes A-B as confidential since they relate to *inter partes* disclosure.

III. SUBMISSIONS

3. On 23 December 2020, the Prosecution discloses to the Defence 396 items (1,423 pages). The disclosed items are in the following packages:

- Pre-Confirmation INCRIM package 14: contains 372 items (594 pages);
- Pre-Confirmation INCRIM package 15: contains 24 items (829 pages).

4. INCRIM Package 14 contains items related to six witnesses not previously disclosed to the Defence and also items that are translations of materials previously disclosed.

5. INCRIM Package 15 contains items related to witness DAR-OTP-P-0131 that were disclosed on 7 December with redactions applied to the identifying information of the witness. The Prosecution re-discloses these items with those redactions being lifted.

6. The Prosecution informs the Single Judge that in these INCRIM packages, all items are either cited in the first and/or second Arrest Warrant applications and/or will be relied upon at the confirmation hearing.

7. Most of them relate to witnesses whose identity can be disclosed to the Defence and the redactions applied to the items are minimal and they are applied according

to the procedure for exceptions to disclosure that was adopted by the Single Judge on 17 August 2020.¹

8. In relation to the witnesses whose identity cannot be disclosed to the Defence at this stage, the Prosecution applied the redactions to the information that might reveal the witnesses' identity. The Prosecution used code F for such redactions. The Prosecution will submit an application for the authorisation of the non-disclosure of the identifying information of the concerned witnesses as instructed by the Chamber.²

9. In relation to item DAR-OTP-0109-0111, the Prosecution applied redactions under the category B.5 to the name of a person residing in a camp of internally displaced persons the witness visited in order to protect other Prosecution witnesses and their family members still residing in that camp.
