TRIAL CHAMBER X of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Al Hassan Ag Abdoul Aziz Ag Mohamed Ag Mahmoud*, having regard to Article 68 of the Rome Statute, Rules 85, 86 and 89 to 92 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the ‘Rules’), and Regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court, issues the following ‘Eleventh decision on the admission of victims to participate in trial proceedings’.

I. Procedural history

1. On 12 March 2020, the Chamber issued its ‘Decision on the procedure for the admission of victims to participate in proceedings for the purposes of trial’ (the ‘First Decision on Victims’ Participation’), notably instructing the Registry to transmit Group A applications (applicants who clearly qualify as victims) to the Chamber no later than 15 days before the commencement of trial.¹
2. On 12 June 2020, on the basis of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Chamber issued a decision extending the deadline for the final transmission of victim applications until the end of the Prosecution case, except for applications already received, for which the initial deadline remained.² The Chamber instructed the Registry to file the newly collected applications on a rolling basis in periodic intervals.³
3. On 12 March 2021, the Chamber issued a further decision on victim participation in which it notably specified ‘that individuals whose applications were received and assessed by the Registry as incomplete before the initial cut-off deadline, as well as applicants who had their initial application rejected, may come forward with complementary information by the extended deadline which was set to the end of the Prosecution case’.⁴

4. On 12 November 2021, the Registry filed its twelfth assessment report on victim applications for participation (the ‘Twelfth Report’),⁵ together with a transmission of 50 Group A applications to the Chamber.⁶

II. Analysis

5. The Chamber incorporates by reference the legal framework applicable to the participation of victims.⁷
6. The Chamber notes that the Twelfth Report refers to 50 applications⁸ which, based on the Registry’s assessment, fall within Group A as they meet the required conditions for the granting of victim status under Rule 85 of the Rules.⁹
7. The Chamber has not identified any clear and material error in the Registry assessment and, in line with the system for admission of victims for participation in trial proceedings, authorises the participation as victims of these 50 applicants.
8. Moreover, the Chamber notes in the Registry’s report that these 50 applicants are already represented or have expressed their willingness to be represented by the single team of LRVs currently representing victims participating at trial.¹⁰ Accordingly, and in line with its prior rulings on this matter,¹¹ the Chamber appoints the single team of LRVs to represent the 50 victims hereby admitted.

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

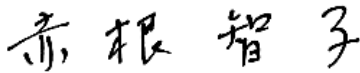
DECIDES to admit the 50 aforementioned applicants as participating victims for the purpose of the trial proceedings; and
