## I. Introduction

1. The Registry submits the present report (“Registry Report”) and its 2 annexes consisting of a public redacted and confidential version of items recognised as evidence formally submitted, pursuant to the “Initial Directions on the Conduct of the Proceedings” (“Directions”),<sup>1</sup> issued on 26 August 2020 by Trial Chamber V (“Chamber”).

## II. Procedural history

2. On 26 August 2020, the Presiding Judge issued the Directions which adopted, among other guidelines, provisions related to the submission of evidence by email.<sup>2</sup> The Registry was directed to file on the record of the case reports indicating which items have been formally submitted by all participants in relation to each witness who testifies.<sup>3</sup>
3. On 22 June 2021, the Chamber instructed the Registry to additionally file confidential versions of the Registry Reports, in order to fully reflect the emails on the case record. The Chamber further instructed that these confidential versions be filed simultaneously with the public version.<sup>4</sup>
4. From 07 to 15 December 2021, the Office of the Prosecution (“Prosecution”) called its twenty-third witness.<sup>5</sup> After the conclusion of the examination of witness P-0876, parties formally submitted items used during the hearings as instructed in the Directions.

5. On 25 May 2022, the Chamber issued the decision on items of evidence recognised as formally submitted for witness P-0876 via email.<sup>6</sup> Pursuant to the Directions, the Registry was instructed to apply redactions as appropriate to the emails enclosed in Annex 1 to the filing.<sup>7</sup>

### III. Applicable law

6. For the purpose of the present submission, the Registry has considered *inter alia* articles 64(7), 64(10) and 67(1) of the Rome Statute and rule 137 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

### IV. Submission

7. In order to enable the parties and participants to suggest specific additional redactions to public Annex 1, the Registry followed the procedure that was adopted in the Directions.<sup>8</sup>
8. The Registry liaised by email with the Prosecution, the Defence for Mr Yekatom, the Defence for Mr Ngaïssona, the Legal Representatives of the Former Child Soldiers Victims (“CLRV1”) and the Legal Representatives of the Victims of the Other Crimes (“CLRV2”).<sup>9</sup> Further redactions were proposed by the parties.<sup>10</sup>
9. Accordingly, the Registry applied redactions to the emails set forth in the following public redacted **Annex 1**: “Decision on Submitted Materials for P-0876”, dated 25 May 2022 at 09h33.

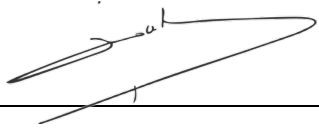
