

ANNEX I

1. On 24 June 2010 the Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) filed the “Prosecution’s Request for Protective and Special Measures for Prosecution Witnesses at Trial”.¹ In its request for final relief, paragraph 57, the Prosecution inadvertently left out witnesses 38, 42 and 209 as persons for whom face and voice distortion and use of pseudonyms are requested (though the application presents arguments in support of the relief sought). In the Annex A attached to the 24 June 2010 Request, the Prosecution also inadvertently misquoted one protective measure for Witness 87.
2. Accordingly, the Prosecution respectfully submits the corrigendum. The corrections in the corrigendum are limited to paragraphs 32, 57 and footnote 28 of the 24 June 2010 Request and page 21 of Annex A.
 - Paragraph 32 should have read “... (i) these victims/witnesses continue to be referred to by their numbers throughout the proceedings, pursuant to Rule 87(3) (d) of the Rules, in order to prevent their identities from being disclosed to the public; (ii) image and voice distortions be applied during their testimony in accordance with Rule 87(3) (c) of the Rules and..”
 - Paragraph 57(i) should have read “Authorize image and voice distortions and assign pseudonyms to witnesses 22, 23, 29, 33, 38, 42 65, 68, 69, 79, 80, 81, 82, 87, 173, 178, 209 and 213 during their testimony;”
 - Footnote 28 should have read “These are witness 75, witness 79 and witness 87”;
 - Page 21 of the Annex A should have read “Be accompanied by a Psychologist or family member”.
