Noting your signed acceptance of this appointment on 5 May 2017, the present letter officially formalizes your appointment as Counsel for Mr Gaddafi in the case *The Prosecutor v. Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi* (ICC-01/11-01/11) (“Gaddafi Case”).¹

In accordance with articles 17 and 18 of the Code of Professional Conduct for counsel (“Code”), your appointment shall be considered effective as of 5 May 2017 and will remain valid until the conclusion of the Gaddafi Case unless otherwise terminated beforehand by your client or in conformity with the pertinent legal texts of the Court.

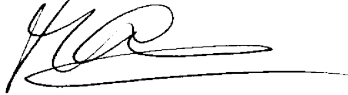
