Entebbe and Kampala towns

In either Entebbe or Kampala the visiting team should spend at least one night at one of the assessed and recommended hotels that offer a relatively safe environment and necessary facilities. Both towns are located on the Lac Victoria border at about 1200 meters altitude. The average temperature around the year ranges from 18 to 27 °C.

Gulu town

Gulu town, with a population of about 150,000 citizens, is the economic and administrative center of Gulu district, located at 340 km north of Kampala. The town is situated at 1100 m altitude and the average temperature across the year ranges from 17 to 29 °C.

Pajule (see attachment 1)

Pajule is a sub-county located in Pader County at about 100 kms East of Gulu. It has a population of about 23,000 people itself (225,000 with perishes and villages surrounding it) [REDACTED] Most of the population is *Acholi* and mixed with *Lango* ethnics.

The ex-IDP camp location is now known as Pajule town , and includes the sub-county, Police ooffices, a big Catholic church and a relatively large commercial center. [REDACTED]

Odek (see attachment 2)

Odek is a sub-county (part of OMORO district) comprising 4 parishes (total population is 42,000 people) and located at 63 km east of Gulu. Most of the population is of *Acholi* ethnic group and mixed with *Lango*. Odek is the official birth place of Joseph Kony, with members of his extended family living in Odek.

The ex-IDP Camp location was centered on the actual Memorial site and the sub-county/police offices. [REDACTED]

Abok (see attachment 3)

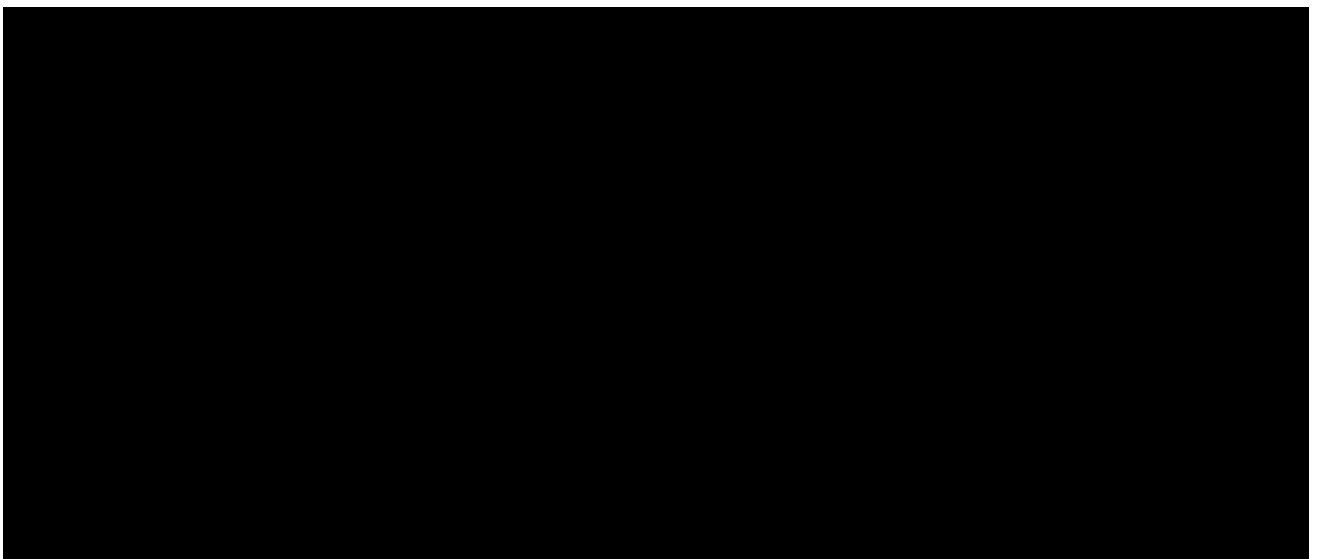
Abok (as part of Oyam district) comprises of 5 parishes with a population of around 20,000 people most of them being *Lango* and mixt with *Acholi* ethnics. Abok is located at 51 kms South - East Gulu and is relatively isolated within Onyam county.

The ex-IDP camp location is centred on the crossroad going to Gulu and Lira and includes the Memorial Site, Sub-county and Police offices. [REDACTED]

Lukodi (see attachment 4)

Lukodi parish/ Bugantira sub-county is a small village of about 2000 people (Acholi ethnic group) located about 20 Kms North of Gulu.

The ex-IDP camp location, at that time being part of Punena parish, was centered on the actual Memorial site and the Lukodi Primary School. [REDACTED]
