Following bringing the email below to the attention of members of the team, I have been asked to request a slight relaxation of the instruction in para. 20 of the Conduct of Proceedings (ICC-02/04-01/15-497) with respects to witness P-250.

Specifically, while the Defence will file a provisional list of material for cross-examination on the proceeding Friday and will endeavour to have a complete list one day before testimony as required by the instructions, we request the possibility to amend the list of documents for the cross-examination of witness P-250 up to the lunch break on Monday (15 January 2018).
