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Dear counsel,

The Single Judge notes the Prosecution's request to authorise witness P-2193 to 'bring his laptop into the VWS' premises prior to his testimony' and into the courtroom, in order to make a short visual presentation demonstrating the process of satellite image analysis that he undertook (email from the Prosecution, 3 March 2021, at 15:35).

Considering the explanations provided by the Prosecution regarding the necessity to bring the witness's laptop and noting the absence of objections thereto, the Single Judge grants the Prosecution's request.

The Single Judge further observes that the concerns raised by the Yekatom Defence and the Common Legal Representatives of Victims of Other Crimes (the 'CLRV') (email from the Yekatom Defence, 3 March 2021, at 16:31; email from the CLRV, 3 March 2021, at 18:27) have been resolved *inter partes* and thus require no further action from the Chamber.

Dear All,

Witness P-2193, whose testimony is scheduled to begin on 22 March 2021, would make a short visual presentation in the Courtroom to demonstrate the process of the satellite image analysis that he undertook. This presentation would be based on his material which has already been disclosed, and to aid in the explanation of his methodology.

For the presentation, P-2193 would use his own laptop, as it has the appropriate software and the necessary material.

To this end, the Prosecution requests that the Trial Chamber authorise Witness P-2193 to bring his laptop into the VWS' premises prior to his testimony, and to bring it into the Courtroom for that purpose. It is our understanding this was granted in both the Ntaganda and Al Hassan cases. The Prosecution understands that in those cases, VWS needed

such permission in order to allow P-2193 to bring his laptop into the courtroom for both his testimony and to test it in Court in advance, as requested by the Court Officer.
