The Prosecution requests a page-limit extension of an additional 20-pages as well as for the submission of an 'argumentative' annex, pursuant to regulations 37(2) and 38 of the Regulations of the Court ("RoC") regarding its First Application for Submission of Documents from the Bar Table. The prospective application concerns email and other electronic evidence obtained from [REDACTED]

The requested extension is necessary to properly substantiate the relevance and probative value of a large number of emails (hundreds) involving six separate accounts, including the accused NGAISSONA and other Anti-Balaka leaders. The application thus explains dozens of email exchanges, including their attachments, as well as corroborating material. In addition, the confidential annex, comprises a chart listing the over 480 items to be submitted, detailing their evidence registration number ("ERN"), type, title, main date of the document, date of disclosure, and setting out the corresponding categories of relevance.

The Prosecution appreciates the Chambers consideration and notes, for the Parties and Participants, that the request should be considered as 'confidential'. Thanks again.
